- **#6 Brett Mitchell QB Evangel** Camp player. Sling type delivery. Under threw two deep balls that were caught by Johnson and Thurman. Has size and strength for position. Low delivery point. Quick release. Needs mechanic and fundamental work.
- **#12 Scott Rislov QB San Jose State** 7th round/priority free agent. Game MVP. Good adjust to the rush, poised in pocket, eyes downfield, can find the outlet receiver. Comfortable in pocket. Steps into throw. Good touch and fundamentals. Throws tight spiral.
- **#14 Tony Johnson WR Penn State** Draft 4th/6th round, depends on verified speed. Fundamentally sound receiver. Good run after catch. Strong. Good receiving skills. Comes back to the ball. Strong hands. Built like a running back. Good blocker.
- **#24 Andrae Thurman WR Southern Oregon/Arizona** Draft 5th/6th rounds. Hand catcher, comes back to the ball. Also returns punts and kickoffs. Soft hands. Will layout for ball. Catches ball at the high point.
- **#80 Lance Young WR Iowa State** Priority free agent. Will trap ball against chest. Good leaping ability. Can return kickoffs and punts not special. More of a body catcher than a hand catcher.
- **#82 Ryan Krause WR Nebraska-Omaha** Free agent. Big wide receiver that must be a slot guy. Poor man's Billy Miller Texas. Lacks quickness out of break. Lacks overall quickness in his game.
- **#44 Ronnie Ghent TE Louisville** Free agent. Receiver only tight end that has inconsistent hands. Below average blocking ability. Lacks bulk and strength. Long arms.
- #46 Matt Kranchick TE Penn State Free agent. Big target. Traps ball against his body. High cut. Must work to stay low and bend to block. Runs hard after catch. Slender build.
- **#84 Nate Lawrie TE Yale** Free agent. Big target. Question speed. Good blocking awareness. Good adjust to block linebackers on second level. Has some upper and lower body stiffness.
- **#26 Larry Croom RB UNLV** Free agent. Has some shake and bake moves. Can make the defender miss. Gets what's blocked. Good effort to block on blitz pickup undersized. Third down back with good vision. Shifty moves.
- **#28 Butchie Wallace RB Marshall** Replaced Koutsos after injury. Free agent. Has average running skills and quickness. Has some inside vision and pick ability. Lacks the strength to move the pile.

- **#28 Tom Koutsos RB Southern Illinois** Injured, did not play. Was a free agent in practice sessions. Has an injury history. Tackle to tackle runner. Lacks speed to turn the corner.
- #30 Derrick Ward RB Ottawa (KS)/Fresno State Draft 5th/7th rounds. Good agility in space. Can run with strength and power or shake you in the open field. Good hands and vision to catch ball. Good cutting ability and inside vision while running ball. Good running skills.
- #32 Dusty McGrorty RB Southern Oregon Camp/free agent. Try hard player with limited ability. Inconsistent hands catching the ball out of backfield. Flashes an upfield burst.
- #52 Quinn Christensen OG/OT Brigham Young Draft late $6^{th}/7^{th}$ round. Played the best of Blue offensive linemen. Played better at OT than OG. Battler. Physical player that gets the job done. Works to finish. Ornery player. Plays with an attitude. Played left OT at times. Was impressive vs. several defensive linemen. Good awareness. Better in pass pro. On the ground and inconsistent early in game. Gets high at times. Long arms.
- #66 Chris McKelvy OG Penn State Camp player. No anchor. Will get driven back into QB. Over extends on the line while run blocking. Consistently leveraged.
- #68 Nate McPeek ROT Marshall Free agent. Loses feet in traffic. Plays high. Consistently driven back into pocket. Below average athlete. Works to finish. Can't anchor.
- #70 Jim Molinaro OT Notre Dame Draft late/7th round/priority free agent. Waist bender that positions defender. Gets pulled by in pass pro. Question strength and balance. Not smooth in footwork. Will over extend on run blocks. Works and walls off defender in pass pro. Has some upper and lower body stiffness. Consistently beat inside. Long arms.
- **#72 Nick Romeo OC Syracuse** Free agent. Undersized. Phone booth player. Butt is one foot off the ground. Basically helped guards on double team because there was no blitzing.
- #74 Luke Salmons OG Marshall Free agent. Maddox #93 for Gray team used him for a punching bag. He leveraged Salmons and drove him back so often it looked like Salmons was on skates. No anchor can't stop a charge. Was beaten by every opponent. Lacks strength and quickness. Needs center help. Plays high. Lacks quickness and range.
- **#76 Kurt Sigler OT Eastern Washington** Camp player. Below average balance. Couldn't handle edge speed or a two move player. OK on down blocks. Must be an OG. Gave up some sacks. Gets beat inside and outside.

- **#42 Raheem Orr DE Rutgers** Free agent. Inconsistent to fight pressure. Struggles to separate from blocker. Was wired to offensive tackles. In drills had a quick first step but did not finish during game. Doesn't make plays. Question awareness and instincts.
- **#48 Michael O'Brien DT Western Illinois** Free agent. Fights pressure. Plays with leverage. Undersized. Active player that goes to the whistle.
- **#54 Gabe Nyenhuis DE Colorado** Draft 5th/7th rounds. Long arms. The Gray had no one to block him. Active, good leverage player that plays with good knee bend. Always around ball pressuring QB. Good effort player. When cut he bounces up and gets in on play. Plays low.
- #78 Sean Mulcahy DT Connecticut Free agent. Good initial quickness but below average change of direction. Plays sluggish after first step. If he doesn't beat you on first step he's stuck on block. Not a fast twitch guy. Inconsistent to use hands stuck on blocker. Will make a play every so often. Had most of success with a weak blocker.
- **#90 Dietrich Canterberry DE UNLV** Draft 7th round. Short area quickness. Plays with leverage. Lacks long pursuit speed. Plays with effort and can push the pocket. Good backside chaser. Finishes play.
- **#92 Christian Ferrara DT Syracuse** Free agent. Usually draws a double team. Fights pressure. Stuck on blocker. One speed player with no moves. Shoots gap. Awkward in movement.
- #94 Derek Kennard DT Nevada Free agent. Takes good pursuit angles. Good motor and effort player. Thick lower body. Lacks height for position. Finishes play.
- #34 Rich Scanlon MLB Syracuse Draft $6^{th}/7^{th}$ rounds. Active player. Has good instincts and awareness. Runs at a good competitive speed. Good to key and diagnose. Physically tough. Average use of hands. Has strength versus the inside run. Functional strength. Short arms.
- #36 Deryck Toles OLB Penn State Free agent. Explosive undersized linebacker. Question instincts. Late reacting at times. Shallow in pass drops. Has a good burst to the ball.
- **#38 Daryl Towns OLB Nevada** Free agent. Active and productive. Good in man to man cover. Downhill player. Plays tall. Not a great knee bender. Undersized with long arms.
- **#40 Renauld Williams OB Hofstra** Free agent. Undersized outside linebacker. Had a sack in game. Gets turned and collapsed at times. Aggressive but out of control. Had several missed tackles. Short arms.

- **#50 Jonathan Harrell IB Northern Iowa** Draft 4th/6th rounds. Athletic linebacker. Has short area agility. Good use of hands and instincts. Has good speed. Was injured most of 2003, groin, etc.
- **#2 Marvin Jackson DC Chadron State** Priority free agent. Waited on deep ball. Needs fundamental and mechanic work.
- **#10 Randee Drew DC Northern Illinois** Free agent. Undersized. Will have problems in matchups with big strong wide receivers. Aggressive, can jump. Good hands. Lacks tackling strength. Willing but not a strong tackler.
- #16 JaMaine Billups SS Iowa State Draft 6th/7th rounds. Physical player. Good on run support. Has an explosive wrap. Jason Belser clone. Will struggle in most m/m matchups.
- **#18 Justin Sandy FS Northern Iowa** Draft 4th/6th rounds. Good hitter. Plays ball in air. Has corner experience. A safety with good man to man skills. Good athletic ability. Effective on special teams. Good to play deep ball. Good lateral movement and back pedal. Good vision and reacts.
- #20 Josh Minkins DC Louisville Free agent. Will have problems in matchups with big receivers. Has average closing quickness. Willing to run support but lacks size. Cut tackler. Gets bounced around.
- **#22 Ben Nauman Safety Augustan (SD)** Draft 5th/7th round. Physical player that is better in a zone scheme than man to man. Good instincts and toughness. Good to read and react. Good use of hands to shed block. Smooth in transition.
- #4 Steve Baker P/PK Southern Oregon Camp player.
- **#8 Steve Azar PK/P Northern Illinois** Camp player. Inconsistent leg strength and accuracy.

- #1 Luke McCown QB Louisiana Tech Priority free agent. Was a shotgun QB. Throws into double coverage. Inconsistent to throwing point. Quick release. Could not make the 15 yard out cut throw to left from right hash. Average arm strength.
- #17 Robert Kent QB Jackson State Draft $6^{th}/7^{th}$ as a project. Throws a wobbly ball. Needs work on all fundamentals and mechanics of QB play. Lost the handle on the ball several times. Long arms and small hands. Good size for a QB 6042, 213.
- **#23 Zach Fletcher WR Alabama** Free agent. Hand catcher. Waits on ball. Long arms and big hands. Possession receiver. Needs to work on all receiver fundamentals and mechanics.
- #39 Terrance Copper WR East Carolina Draft $6^{th}/7^{th}$ round. Good hands caught several low balls in practice on fingertips. Also returns punts and kickoffs. Built like a running back. Has some run after catch ability. Average size 5114, 201. Will compete. Question ability to separate.
- #81 Huey Whittaker WR South Florida Draft 4th/6th round. Big receiver. Billy Miller (Texans) type H back or big slot receiver. Big target. Physical receiver. Good downfield blocker. Reportedly had a scope 2 weeks prior to Blue/Gray practices. Long arms. Well built. Draft status depends on verified 40. Big target on slant, hitch, and under routes. No yards after catch.
- #85 Dre Fulghum WR Alabama Free agent. Possession receiver. Can't separate from defender. Big hands. Strong runner. Can't separate from defensive backs.
- #43 Richard Owens TE/LS Louisville Draft $6^{th}/7^{th}$ round. Long snapper that plays a position. Quick into defender with first steps. Good at underneath and flat pass routes. Long arms and big hands.
- **#87 Michael Gaines TE Central Florida** Draft risk. Better as a priority free agent. Big receiver. Did not play in 2003. Looked sluggish and out of shape. Made a nice overhead catch in practice. Question speed (5.1?) Long arms and big hands.
- **#89 Bobby Blizzard TE North Carolina** Draft 7th round or priority free agent. Has soft hands. Will body catch as needed. Average speed. Position, wall off blocker. Had a viral infection in fall. May not be up to speed.
- #25 DeJuan Green RB South Florida Priority free agent. Has some shake and bake moves. Slips tacklers has quick feet and a quick first step. Can make defenders miss. Georgia transfer. Compact build, 5110, 200. Has the ability to make a team. Needs to improve blocking.

- **#27 Keylon Kincade RB SMU** Free agent. Good inside vision and cutting ability. Needs work on blocking. Question finish speed. Has some natural instincts and running skills. Average size back.
- #29 Vick King RB McNeese State Free agent. Good balance. Straight ahead runner. Good inside vision. Needs to improve blocking skills.
- #31 Vonta Leach RB East Carolina Draft 6th/7th round. Tough inside runner. Good balance when hit. Good inside vision and cutter. More straight line but can run over defenders. Good hands to catch ball. Had a tackle on punt team. Inconsistent blocker. 6000, 248. Effective catcher in flat.
- #55 Dennis Alexander OL Alabama Camp guy. Plays upright and high. Lacks power and leverage. Lacks thick butt and hips no butt. Borderline reject. No compete. Goes to knees on contact. Soft player. Not physical. No finish.
- #65 Cedric Fields OG Baylor Reject. Lacks strength and athletic ability to play on next level. Can't anchor. Inconsistent to finish. Lacks size. Out of place at this game.
- #67 Branden Hall OT Troy State Free agent. Lacks lower body strength to anchor and stop charge. Overextends and goes to ground. Struggles to block moving target.
- #69 Atlas Herrion OT Alabama Camp guy. High on pulls. No anchor. Gets driven back into pocket. Can't handle edge speed. Consistently was put on skates. Could not sit down. Below average balance. No knee bend.
- **#71 Mark Moroz OT Wake Forest** Free agent. Must play offensive guard. Lacks thick lower body. Plays high and looks awkward in space. Has some mirror and slide but struggles with edge speed. Canadian. No knee bend. Gets up on toes.
- #75 Nick Seitze OC Kentucky Free agent. Plays high and has stiffness in upper and lower body. Lacks bend to anchor and stop charge. No adjust in open field.
- #77 Jupiter Wilson OG North Carolina Camp guy. Upright player. Not a space player. Lacks anchor to stop charge. Consistently beat inside. High on pulls. Floundered around as a pass and run blocker. Lazy player.
- #53 Jon Bradley DE Arkansas State Draft 5th/6th round. Good initial quickness to shoot down line of scrimmage. Doesn't stay blocked. Explosive punch that jolts blocker. Good effort and quickness. Has quick hands and used his hands effectively played both DE and DT. Was more effective outside.
- #57 Nautyn McKay-Loescher DE Alabama Draft 5th/6th round. Only objective in Blue/Gray game was to burst upfield to sack the QB. Did not respect run. He did get a sack. Good initial quickness. Out of control on pass rush. Good effort player but took

- himself out of too many plays. Average change of direction to turn corner. Canadian. 3-4 outside rusher. 6024, 257.
- **#61 Michale Spicer DE Western Carolina** Free agent. Good use of hands. Quick to shed blocker in 1 on 1 drills. Good leverage and punch. Undersized and got engulfed at times. May be a 3-4 outside rusher. Gets pushed around pile on rush. 6016, 255, long arms.
- #91 Brandon Calton DT East Tennessee State Draft 6th/7th round. Good effort player. Lacks big thick butt and thighs. Quick first step. Better than average lateral quickness. Had a caused fumble in game. Works hard every play. 6030, 291, average arm length.
- #93 Anthony Maddox DT Delta State Draft 6th/7th round or priority free agent. Florida State background. Does not stay blocked. Explosive with good hand use. Sudden to hit gaps in slant and angles stunts. High motor, good effort player. Will get bounced at times on down block. Consistently pressed the pocket. Has good instincts and field awareness. Good downfield pursuit and effort. Has ability. Overage? 6012, 286, long arms.
- **#95 Damane Duckett DT East Carolina** Draft 5th/6th round. Big thick butt and thighs. Not a fast twitch player. Not a quick footed, athletic lineman. More of a power, press the pocket player. Plays tall because he is tall. His role for the NFL will be an inside push guy that takes up space. Clogs middle. Average instincts. Gives effort just not quick. 6060, 303, long arms 35 inches.
- #99 Jeremy Caudill DT Kentucky Draft 4th/6th round. Fights pressure good initial quickness. Runs his feet to QB. Explosive inside push. Sudden first step. Good timing between hands and feet. Good upfield and lateral quickness. Strong hands to separate from blocker. Played both DE and DT. Has short arms. Consistently pressed the pocket. Finishes the play. High effort player.
- #5 **Derrick Pope OB Alabama** Draft 6th/7th round. Undersized as a linebacker. May be a run stuffing strong safety. Downhill player. Good to read and react. Will finish pursuit. I'm not sure where he's going to play, but he is going to play. Attacks the line of scrimmage. Contact player and hitter. Active in special teams. 5111, 222, big hands and long arms.
- #33 Stevie Baggs OB Bethune-Cookman Free agent. May be a medical. Pigeon toed looks like he walks on his ankles. Good motor and aggressiveness. Out of control as a tackler at times. Active player. Big hitter. Makes plays.
- #35 Kellen Brantley OB Wake Forest Priority free agent. Instinctive. Good tackler in space. Appears to have good coverage awareness. Plays high. Good hitter. Long arms.
- #45 Cody Spencer IB North Texas Draft 5th/6th round. Good instincts and ability to react quickly. Sideline to sideline pursuit. Active tackler. Good zone awareness and

- change of direction in open field. Struggles to protect legs versus cut blocks. Can work effectively through traffic. Active player that contributes on special teams. In the game he broke up passes, filled running lanes, tackles the TE on a TE screen, made tackles on special teams and had 10+ tackles.
- **#51 Jason Clark OB Mississippi State** Free agent. Has some upper and lower body stiffness. OK space player. Good lateral speed. Downhill player. Quick to break on ball.
- #3 Marcus Winn FS Alabama State Free agent. Aggressive player. Played as an outside linebacker in scheme at times. Did a good job of overlapping corner on deep coverage. 6001, 219.
- #7 Michael Waddell DC North Carolina Draft 6th/7th round. Corner and kick returner. Flashes quick break on ball. One speed guy fast. Beat in coverage by 80 Young. Inconsistent open field tackler. Cover corner that has raw skills and speed.
- **#9 Chris Thompson DC Nicholls State** Draft 4th/5th round. Can track and trail wide receivers. Good tackler in space. Plays deep ball at high point. No receiver separated from him. Good awareness. Has speed and hand quickness.
- #11 Rayshun Reed SS Troy State Free agent. Will hit on support. Up quickly if he sees it.
- #37 Quintin Williams SS Wake Forest Draft 6th/7th round. Good effort on support. Struggles to play ball in the air. Box type run support safety only. Active tackler. Throws body around. Hitter. Productive.
- #41 DeAndre Eiland DC South Carolina -7^{th} round, priority free agent. Needs to stick his foot in the ground. Loses wide receiver in separation. Gets beat in coverage. May be a cover two support corner only.
- **#15 Nate McKinney PT Appalachian State** Free agent. 55 yard punt, 4.02 hang time. Held for PATs.
- #21 Josh Scobee PK Louisiana Tech Draft $6^{th}/7^{th}$ round or priority free agent. KO 73 yards/4.23, 64/4.29, 75/4.27, 70/4.09. Made 37 yard field goal. Showed good poise on botched snap. No rush on field goals and PATs. Gets ball up high and quick. Good leg strength.

- #44 Andrew Battle DE Indiana (PA) Late draft/priority free agent. Has sudden edge speed. Undersized. May project to an outside linebacker. He needs to develop moves to change up on the OT. 3-4 outside edge rusher.
- #77 Cole Bean OG Catawba Free agent, short in stature with short arms.

 Battler/mauler type. Tries to muscle defender. That isn't going to happen the next level.

 Scrappy undersized OG with limited ability.
- **#42 Damian Birch DE Fairmont State** Free agent, did not run. Had a left knee strain. 3-4 outside edge rusher.
- **#40 Toure Carter DC Ashland** Camp player at best. Undersized corner who returns punts and kickoffs. Limited exposure.
- #9 Duron Croson RB Fort Valley State No show Played in Las Vegas Classic.
- #89 Nataniel Doddridge TE Ouachita Baptist Not a prospect, undersized and slow for position. Caught a TD pass in game. Lacks blocking strength and ability to separate.
- #72 Khiawatha Downey OG Indiana (PA) No Show. Played in Las Vegas Classic.
- #60 Alan Dunn OG Tusculum Camp player, won Langer Award as the game's best offensive lineman. Pusher, leaner type blocker. Was driven back no anchor or balance. Played high and was inconsistent to move feet. Grabs and holds a lot. Struggles with edge speed. Has size, however needs a lot of work.
- #25 Craig Duppong RB Wayne State (MI) Did not play right ankle sprain.
- #20 Ryan Ferguson SS Bentley Not a prospect, lacks speed.
- **#29 Cortlandt Florence RB Tuskegee** Camp player only. One speed player. Will need reps.
- #3 Michael Glover DC East Stroudsburg Free agent, undersized corner who may contribute in a nickel or dime package.
- #93 Junior Glymph DT Carson Newman Free agent defensive tackle who needs more upper body bulk and strength. Gets some upfield push. Has long arms that he needs to develop to grab and pull. Arm over, rip, etc. Plays too high and gets rolled out at times. Needs to bend and play low.

- #21 Michael Grant DC Mars Hill Late draft or free agent. Active player who has good awareness. Will throw his body around to make a play. Good ball skills. Physical player who supports the run. Good ball instincts. Quick to read and react. Box type safety. Can't be isolated with speed receivers. Understands the game. Smart heady player who should contribute on special teams.
- #7 Will Hall QB North Alabama Not a prospect, lacks height/weight/ and speed for position. Lacks arm strength. Great intangibles. Harlon Hill winner.
- **#58 Dan Holland IB Mansfield** Camp player, lacks height/weight/ and speed for position. Good instincts. Active, will be one of last cuts. Good downhill player. Short arms.
- #6 Eric Houle KO Saginaw Valley State Not a prospect, lacks leg strength.
- #98 Khanis Hubbard OB Catawba Late draft or free agent. Active player that finishes play. Will finish long and short pursuit. Likes to play game. Will have to play up if he's going to make it on the next level. Should contribute on special teams. Needs work on all techniques.
- #10 Jamel Jackson DC Catawba Camp player. Fringe prospect that is active. Will lay out for ball. Up quick on run support. Good hands. Had an interception in game. Needs work on all techniques and mechanics. Raw prospect.
- #76 Silas Johnson OT Hillsdale Camp player. Struggles with edge speed. May have to go inside to guard. Big hands but average arm length. Needs tech and mech work.
- **#14 Scott Mackey FS Grand Valley State** Camp player. Has fringe speed for position. All position specifics are average.
- #99 Anthony Maddox DT Delta State No Show. See Blue/Gray game.
- **#83 Cesare Manning WR Indianapolis** Camp player with inconsistent hands. Has long arms and big hands for position.
- #5 Ruvell Martin WR Saginaw Valley State Late Draft or priority free agent. Slot type receiver that has the size and measurables. He doesn't trust his hands. He cradles several catches and double catches others. Big target who can make the overhead catch. Huge hands and long arms. Good developmental project. Has some good blocks during game. Needs tech and mech work.
- #17 Glenn Martinez WR Saginaw Valley State Free agent with average hand strength. Has inconsistent hands. Raw receiver who needs technique work.
- **#51 Matt McCoy OT Ferris State** No Show

- #15 John Newberry PT Central Arkansas Not a prospect, lacks leg strength.
- #11 Jason Ocean OB Livingstone Not a prospect, lacks height/weight/speed for position.
- **#1 Eric Plant WR Virginia State** Free agent. Has quick feet in and out of break. Undersized receiver with speed.
- #63 William Ricks OC Slippery Rock Not a prospect, lacks height and strength for position.
- #52 Dedrick Roper DE Northwood Free agent. 3-4 rush end or project outside linebacker. Active player who has all the raw skills and speed for position.
- #75 Darrick Sanders OT Arkansas Monticello Camp player. Has the size, arm length, and hand size. Has slow feet. Gets too high and can't anchor cut blocker. He needs to improve foot quickness and game awareness.
- **#8 Ed Smith IB Fairmont State** Not a prospect. Lacks height/weight/speed for position.
- #90 Derrick Spencer DT Fayetteville State Free agent. Observed in practice. Did not play in game has heel spurs.
- #4 Erreick Stewart QB Cheyney State Not a prospect. Lacks arms strength and accuracy. Aims ball. Attended 3 different colleges.
- **#48 Bejey Thomas FS Bloomsburg** Free agent with questionable speed. Returns punts. Needs mechanic and technique work.
- **#80 Landon Trusty TE Central Arkansas** Free agent, possible offensive line projection. Slender lower body, however. Cradle catcher. Plays high because he is so tall. Needs to bend his knees to get under his blocks.
- **#73 Joe Valvoda OC Edinboro** Not a prospect, slow feet. Lacks height and needs reps lacks awareness.

- #96 Darrell Lee DE Florida Free agent. 6035, 271. Long arms 35 ½". Pressures QB off the edge. More athlete than football player. Has the measurables. Lacks strength vs. the run. Low motor. Slow twitch guy.
- #97 Kory Klein DT Oklahoma Free agent. 6015, 280. Fights pressure. Gets stuck on block. Lacks girth to hold ground inside. Short arms -30 ½".
- #98 Robert Pollard DE TCU Draft 5th/6th round. Active player with his hit and spin move. Good job of keeping his hands inside blockers hands. Effective on bull rush and playing with leverage. Will get swallowed up on line of scrimmage. Effective on cut backs. Good hitter.

Jason Wright Northwestern – RB, 5100, 210, Draft 5th/6th round. Quick into hole. Has good lower body strength. Runs with power. Has outstanding hands for position. Short strider that can shake a tackler. A utility type player – can be a wide receiver, running back, and return specialist (kickoffs). Going to medical school.

Blake Elliott St. John's (MN) – WR, 5116, 207, not a prospect. Can't separate from defensive backs. Lacks speed.

Sammy Moore Washington State – WR 5100, 199, Draft 5th/6th round. Built like a running back. Effective on reverses and in punt returns. Has excellent speed. Can out run angles. Hands are a bit inconsistent. Can make the overhead one-handed catch. Runs under routes. Has the ability to slip tacklers.

Can reach and extend away from his body for the ball. Plucker. Needs more strength. Returns kickoffs. Should contribute on special teams. Careless with ball at times. Needs ball security.

Ben Hartsock Ohio State – TE, 6033, 256, Draft 3rd round. Outstanding second level blocker. Physical on down blocks. Catches the ball in his hands. Smart, heady player that understands his position and the game. Can adjust block on the move. Keeps his hands inside frame and controls defender. Can seal the edge. Compete package receiver and blocker.

Ben Moa Utah – TE, 6013, 250, Free agent. Wall off position blocker. H-back type that has good hands and athletic ability. Can pluck the ball. Fringe size tight end. Can adjust to ball thrown behind him. Will layout for the low ball catch. One speed guy with no burst.

Keith Willis Virginia Tech – TE, 6051, 256, Draft 5th/6th round. Position wall off blocker that is a good blocker on the second level. Good blocker with underrated hands. Has the speed to get down the seam. Will need to keep knees bent on blocks because he is high cut. Made a tackle as DE late in game. Underused at VA Tech. May be sleeper of the draft.

Todd Backert Washington – OC, 6031, 301, Free agent. Helps inside as a center. Needs to improve hand use. Wall off position blocker. Plays high and loses knee bend at times. Gets driven back. Gets beat inside. Will lock on and use hands in drive block. Overextends and lunges. Good initial step but no finish. Not a space player. Gets a stalemate but no movement.

Brendan Darby San Diego State – OT, 6057, 295, Camp at best. Plays high. Loses knee bend. High on pulls and fold blocks. Hops in pass pro. Doesn't slide his feet. Couldn't block #98 Lee from Florida. Struggles with edge speed. Can position and wall off at times. Holds a lot and doesn't move feet.

Tim Faiaita Arizona State – OG, 5116, 312, Free agent. Very short for a OG. Can sit down in pass protection. Aggressive player with a good use of hands. Locks out and walls off defender. Plays with leverage. Can anchor. Good punch. Has good balance and plays square to the line of scrimmage. Gets push on defender. Moves his feet.

Norm Katnick USC – OC, 6037, 272, Free agent. Undersized center that lacks strength. Good football intelligence and awareness. Played both guard and center in game. Can't

anchor bull rush. Will overextend and go to ground. Is crafty and creative to make up for his size.

Jason Lenzmeier New Mexico – OT, 6040, 299, Free agent. High on pulls. Tackles DT on pull. Lacks knee bend and strength to anchor. Waist bender. Doesn't move his feet. Goes to the ground in space. Drops his head in pass protection. Awkward and flounders in movement. Gets driven back.

Josh Parrish Washington State – OG, 6053, 334, Draft 6th/7th round. Mauler. Physical player that is good initially but doesn't finish. Will drop head on pass protection at times. Has some good punch and push at times. Will lock out on pass pro. Gets hands inside but is inconsistent to move feet. Big wide body that tries to muscle you and loses technique. Football intelligence is in question.

Nick Seitz Kentucky – OC, 6043, 297, Free agent. Too tall for a center. Plays high and gets driven back. Stops legs on contact. Does both shotgun and conventional snap. Below average foot quickness. Walls off and positions defender. Gets beat off edge. Lacks foot quickness and technique.

Sean Souza Utah – OT, 6040, 306, Not a prospect. Below average balance. Gets beat inside. Awkward in movement. Can't redirect or recover. Non-athlete that drops his head in pass protection. Below average to move his feet. Cut blocker. Lacks technique and mechanics. Can't handle edge speed. Grabber. Couldn't block #49 Ball or #93 Nyenhuis.

Houston Ala Hawaii – DE, 5116, 244, Camp player. Small undersized edge rusher that got stuck on blocks. Good effort to ball. Goes to the whistle. Has some edge quickness. Good lateral quickness. Has a quick 1st step. A camp 3-4 rush end.

Brett Beard Southeastern (**LA**) – DT, 6024, 291, Free agent. Gets inside push and presses the pocket. Bull rusher.

Isaac Brown Washington State – OB/DE, 6017, 227, Free agent. Project to outside linebacker. Plays the game on his feet. Athletic. Question hands. He dropped an interception as an outside backer. Has edge speed. Makes plays. Undersized even as an edge rusher. Can get swallowed up by big offensive tackles.

Brian Howard Idaho – DT/DE, 6025, 285, Late draft/priority free agent. Good effort to the ball. Quick into gap. Good initial quickness. Gets bounced around at times. Fights double team on line of scrimmage. Appears tight as a defensive end. Question strength at times.

Omar Nazel USC – DE, 6037, Quick and athletic. Has an upfield burst. Takes good pursuit angles. Will finish long and short pursuit. He's a chase player from the backside. Better on plays away than on plays at him. Disruptive player. Gets hurries or pressures. Gets stuck on block at times and walled off. Needs to use more moves.

Jeremiah Williams Washington State – DT, 6035, 291, Camp player. Has the strength to push the pocket. Picks his spots. Motor isn't always running. Will loaf after ball carrier at times. Can be a one gap push the pocket player.

Maurice Jones South Florida – LB, 6003, 241, Draft 5th/6th round. Athletic linebacker that can run. Good lateral speed. Can work through traffic. Downhill player. Susceptible to cut blocks. Takes himself out of plays at times. Instincts are in question. Inconsistent wrap up tackler. May be more athlete than football player.

Caleb Miller Arkansas – LB, 6027, 214, Draft 5th/6th round. Active. Good downhill player. Lines up in a blitzing stance with right foot up. Not parallel. Flashed some edge speed when lined up outside. Good lateral quickness. Good speed. Quick to read and react. Should contribute on special teams. Had a tackle on kickoff team. Fills the gaps. Will face up. Lacks bulk.

Justin Riley Ball State – LB, 6012, 245, Physical player.

Melvin Simmons USC – LB, 6004, 232, Draft late/priority free agent. Active undersized linebacker. Put hand down as an edge rusher at times. Above average openfield tackler. Fills running lanes quickly. Must play in a covered up scheme when he can run to ball. Should contribute on special teams. Good athletic ability. Will compete.

Joseph Siofele Arizona – LB, 6005, 244, Not a prospect. Plays high without leverage. made a tackle on kickoff team. Gets caught in traffic. Will take bad angles to ball. Below average tackler. Gets his legs cut.

Carlos Joseph Miami – OT, 6051, 305, Draft 3rd round. Gives ground too fast on pass pro. Footwork is not smooth. Hop steps in pass pro. Plays high and clamps DT. Gets hands outside frame too often. When he plays high he gets bulled and driven back.

Jesse Keaulana-Kamaker Kansas State – OG, 6010, 276, Not a prospect. Lacks size and strength. No anchor. Flashes some punch and finish. Played before hometown crowd.

Mark Moroz Wake Forest – OT, 6030, 289, Free agent. Must play inside. Lacks the foot quickness to handle edge speed. Plays high. Doesn't play with strength. Loses leverage. Takes bad angles to second level. Not smooth in footwork. Players that line up inside or outside of him kill him with edge speed. Can't handle double moves.

Hugh Reilly Georgia Tech – OC, 6034, 293, Draft late/priority free agent. Good football awareness. Helps inside. Will lock out and position defender. Struggles to anchor at times. Will get driven back. #95 Williams. He will compete. Will push defender by pile. Will leak through and take good angles to 2nd level.

AJ Ricker Missouri – OC, 6026, 296, Priority free agent. Good football awareness. Look for someone to block. Good initially but overextends and goes to ground at times. Good use of hands. Position blocker. Will get movement at times. Average footwork.

Matt Ball UCLA – DE, 6056, 283, Free agent. Good lateral quickness. Had a half sack in game. Caused 2 hurries. Hustled downfield on pursuit and made a tackle. Got walled off inside.

He was disappointing because he started 44 games. Crafty center that has size 6035, 294 and smarts. Big hands and short arms.
- **#71 Lenny Vandermade OC USC** Free agent. Undersized 6020, 275. Physical player. Good on block back. Short arms. Was 2-2 in one on ones. Has good critical factors quickness, leverage, recovery, reach and seal, sustain, linebacker adjust and pull. Will have problems with power rush and big guys on his nose at OC or OG. Limited growth potential.
- #72 Chris Rhodes OT Weber State Free agent. Plays high. Was 2-2 in the one on ones but he held and got his hands outside the frame. Has the size for a tackle 6053, 312. Long arms 35" and big hands 10 ½", but is limited by his athletic ability and functional strength.
- #73 Dominic Furio OC New Mexico Free agent. Physical player that works to finish blocks. Aggressive. Effective at helping guards. Good awareness. Plays with a good pad level. Shorter than ideal 6017, 301. Has short arms 30 \(^1/4\)".
- #74 Jake Scott OT Idaho 4th round. Best overall lineman in the Las Vegas Classic game. Excellent redirect. Smooth in his mirror and slide. Effective and smart on cut off angles to second level. Could play any position on the line. Seals the backside. Gets hands up quickly and inside defenders. Good in space. Good body control. Knee bends with good technique. Sudden movement on ball. Good quickness after start. Plays with a good base and leverage. Good balance. Has some uncoil explosiveness. Adjust and recovery is outstanding. Can position and turn defender. Maintains contact. Quick to position and seal off. Has the quickness to maintain contact. Adjusts to movement, finishes block. Good downfield effort. Follows through on short and long pull. Adjusts on run. - #76 Forest Vance OT UC-Davis Priority free agent. Must move inside to guard. Beat off edge for a sack. Wall off position blocker. Needs technique and mechanic work. Above average athlete that can position, wall off, and slide his feet. Can run DE by QB. Must get used to speed at higher level. Needs more anchor strength. Inconsistent finish and sustain. Needs better use of hands.
- #77 Nicholas Zuniga OG North Texas Camp player. Struggles to block edge speed. Below average quickness. Lacks anchor strength. Works to mirror and slide his feet. Effort player with limited ability. Bends his knees. Scrappy, will work to finish block. Effective walling off players in this game. May have hope as a center only guy. Short man, short arms.
- #78 Thomas Herrion OG Utah Draft 6th/7th round. Has all the tools but plays undisciplined at times. Will compete. Has the strength to stop a charge. Second best lineman after Jake Scott. Walls off and position defender. Effective on fold blocks and pulls but needs to be quicker. Stays on his feet. Can adjust. Strong. Completely overpowered DTs at times. Worked to finish and sustain. Slides his feet well at left tackle in game. Good initially but will lose his knee bend and gets too high at times. Always blocks or mauls somebody. Has brute strength. Not pretty but gets the job done. He manhandled #55 Calton in game. May need reps. He didn't keep hands inside defenders in one on ones. Had some technique breakdowns.

- #80 Travon Magee TE Kansas State Priority free agent. Huge tight end, 6047, 279 with long arms. Will need reps. Waist bender type blocker. Inconsistent to move feet. Plays high and without leverage as a blocker. Can pluck the ball. Developmental project. Looks the part. Needs mechanic and technique work in every phase of the game. Average speed. Slow twitch guy.
- #81 Clarence Moore WR Northern Arizona Late draft. Status will depend on speed. Big smooth receiver. Laid out for several low ball catches. Can reach and extend for ball. Needs work on route running and nuances of receiver play but has raw skills. Slot type receiver, 6053, 200. Long arms 34 3/8". Was a hand catcher in practice. Will compete for ball.

- **#83 Marque Davis WR Fresno State** Free agent. Undersized wide receiver that catches the ball in his hands. Quick in and out of cuts. Lacks deep speed. Medium and short area receiver.
- **#84 David Relf WR UNLV** Not a prospect. Backup receiver at UNLV. Small receiver with limited skills.
- **#86 Adam Stecker TE Air Force** Not a prospect. Waist bender as a blocker. Over extends and goes to ground as a run blocker. Dropped a seam pass in game. Double catches ball. Does not have good hands.
- **#88 Malcolm Floyd WR Wyoming** Late draft/priority free agent. Big target, good adjust to ball. Can pluck and snatch ball with hands. Had a good week of practice. Did not see him in the game. 6044, 207. Has good speed. Has overall inconsistencies at times.
- **#90 Aaron McConnell DT Pittsburg State** Late draft. Flashes explosiveness. High motor great effort player. Sudden quickness into gaps. Penetrator. Constantly pressured quarterbacks. Was downfield to cover punts. Fights double teams. Whipped #78 Hoffman like a rented mule. Will be effective in certain schemes. Short arms. Was 6-2 in one on ones. Good bull rush and leverage plays.
- #92 Vince Babin DE Tuskegee Not a prospect. Lacks edge speed. Was stuck on blocks. Consistently walled off. Lacks strength to play run.
- #93 Roderick Green DE Central Missouri $-4^{th}/5^{th}$ round. Sudden situation pass rusher. Has a rare burst off edge. Quick upfield acceleration. Has no respect or regard for the run. Runs to ball. Disruptive player. Out of control at times. Gets dumb penalties. Will need numerous reps and player friendly defensive scheme that limits his responsibilities. Short arms. Will contribute on special teams. (Garry Stills, Kansas City).

Good judgment and field vision. Clutch player that delivered big plays and displayed confidence. Defensive recognition was excellent. Pre snap reads took him to his receiver immediately. (Limited coverages made his iob easy. He looked like a surgeon slicing up the secondary). Has a quick set up and release from center. Has good pocket presence and feel. Outstanding delivery quickness. Has a quick and live arm. Excellent anticipation and timing. Has has good eyes for the field. Has the arm strength to make all the throws to win games. Can stretch a secondary deep or make all the medium and short touch passes. Can put the ball through the window of defense. Can adjust throw and vary delivery. Both velocity and trajectory. Don't worry about delivery – he shows you the baby. Has a lot of Brett Favre in him. Played in the shot gun in college. Made a good adjustment to take snap directly from under center. He gets the ball there in time. Has excellent ball placement. Has outstanding poise to wait until the last second and guns ball in there. Has outstanding field awareness and can shred a blitz. Cody Pickett Washington – 6033, 227, 3rd/4th round. Has good touch on short and medium passes. Good poise and is an effective runner. Has good velocity on his passes. Throws quick rhythm passes the best. Ball control passer. Has a quick release. Can adjust his throws according to looks. Good athlete that can make plays with his feet. Rusty in practice because of layoff.

Matt Schaub Virginia – 6054, 237, 4th/5th round. Ball control passer. Has average arm strength. Accurate in short and medium pass routes. Throws into coverage despite his intelligence. He appears to make most of his mistakes when he's heavily rushed. Has limited mobility. Most of success is with the short dink and dunk passes. Good on screens. Lacks long accuracy. Backup type quarterback.

John Navarre Michigan – 6053, 249, 4th/5th round. Accuracy off in bowl practices and game. System timing passer. Not real mobile. Will sidestep rush. Gets a lot of passes tipped because he drops the ball down on delivery. Better accuracy on short and medium passes. He hangs the deep ball. Streaky QB. Deadly when he gets hot. Will throw into coverage. Will compete. Big right handed QB. Inconsistent accuracy. Accuracy depends on timing. Is he Elvis Grbac or Todd Collins?

Josh Harris Bowling Green – 6010, 235, late draft/free agent. System quarterback. Lacks accuracy in practice and game. Mobile. Has the ability to scramble for positive yards. Was effective and productive in their shot gun offense. Developmental type QB that has an average release. Question decisions.

Ben Watson Georgia – 6033, 253, 1st/2nd round talent. Good athlete that works to maintain working contact. Good adjust to a poorly thrown pass. Catches the ball in his hands. Can beat man to man coverage. Good initial quickness. Can escape press. Has a downfield burst. Has quickness in and out of cuts. Can separate from defender. Good hands. Can catch in a crowd and has good run after catch. Has the speed to take it to the house.

Chris Cooley Utah State – 6033, 257, 4th/5th round. Good route runner. Versatile TE, H-back, fullback. Can adjust block on run. Has frame to get bigger. Reminds me of Ken Dilger when he came out of Illinois. Speed is question mark (as it was with Dilger). Good hands. Long snapper. Average was in the low .75 range. Good coverage recognition. Quick in and out of cuts. Finds holes in void area. Crafty in and out of cuts to separate. Good ball reactions. Can adjust to bad pass. Soft hands. Can make the tough catch. Gets some RAC yards.

Kris Wilson Pittsburgh – 6016, 246, Free agent. Undersized tight end that is not a big target. Hard for QB to see down the field. Screen off, wall off type blocker. Journeyman type TE (Luther Broughton). Average speed. Has inconsistent to separate from defender. Can track ball. Good concentration. Will reach and extend for ball. Can catch in crowd. Body catcher at times. Lacks overall size to be an effective blocker. Needs to improve ball security.

Ronnie Ghent Louisville – 6023, 244, Free agent. Inconsistent hands. Lacks blocking strength. Tries to position and wall off defender. Receiver only type tight end that was not impressive in practice or the game.

Running Backs

Greg Jones Florida State – 6013, 250, 1st round. Powerful running back. Bruising, punishing back. Big and strong. Runs through arm tackles. Good cutback vision. Brings power and strength to running game. Runs with chest over toes. Physical runner that runs with balance and effort. Knee may not be 100 percent. Needs to be checked. Wants to be a RB, not a fullback. Flashed some punishing blocks. Chiseled out of granite.

Julius Jones Notre Dame – 5095, 208, 2nd round. Good vision and inside cutting ability. Has good hands. Physical back that makes defenders miss. Cut blocker on pass protection but will also stay in your face. Compact runner that returns kickoffs. Determined runner with good effort. Has an explosive burst around the corner. Strong runner with good cutting ability. Good hands to catch the balls out of backfield. Keeps legs driving on contact. Hits hole quickly. Dynamic player. Fights way through defense – he didn't have a lot of running room. Can break tackles with speed and strength. Can make defenders miss. Good all around back that can contribute on special teams.

Cedric Cobbs Arkansas – 6001, 217, draft 3rd round. Slams ball up inside. Good blocker. Slasher that is deceptively fast. Has speed and strength. Thick butt and thighs. Has power and acceleration. Breaks tackles. Not easy to tackle. Check hamstring problem. Catches ball in his hands. Has off field problems. Returns kickoffs.

Mewelde Moore Tulane – 5105, 205, 3rd round. Quick into hole, good vision. Slips tacklers. Good cutting ability. Instinctive runner. Patient and runs to daylight. Good balance. Gets to outside with cutting ability. Runs good patterns. Can separate from defenders. Understands the passing game. Good athlete. Can adjust to poor pass. Good hands. Can catch ball away from body. Has stamina and endurance.

Michael Turner Northern Illinois – 5102, 237, draft 4th/5th round. Worked at fullback during the week. Body catches passes. One speed guy that can avoid tacklers. Doesn't play with 4.40 speed. Pick and slide type runner with some slash at times. Slows to cut. Runs hard between tackles. Bounces ball to outside. Doesn't trust his speed. More deliberate than explosive. Average initial quickness.

Tatum Bell Oklahoma State – 5105, 201, 4th round. More of a one back set type back without the size. Quick to line of scrimmage. Upright back that is more of a straight line runner. Can run the zone, stretch play wide, and burst around the corner. Question vision at times. Hits the seams in the defense. Average blocker that can pick up the blitz but also absorbs contact.

Thomas Tapeh Minnesota – 6010, 243, 5th/6th round. One back set type that plays fullback. Good receiver out of backfield. Can reach and extend for ball. Can break tackles after catch. Willing blocker. Has vision and cutting ability. Big back that is tough to tackle. Effective at blocking corner support. Will position/wall off block. Seals inside on perimeter. Tackle to tackle runner. Good body lean. Straight line runner. Born in Liberia.

Brandon Johnson Auburn -5104, 230, $5^{th}/6^{th}$ round. Fullback. Tough guy that will get a lick on defender. Effective cut and roll blocker. Role in offense is that of a blocker and underneath rerceiver. Has good hands.

Shaud Williams Alabama – 5074, 184, late round/free agent. Undersized running back. Flashes good quickness and vision into hole. Good adjust to poor pass. Squirts through holes. Returns punts. Some pick. Has strength for a small back. Good lateral quickness. Durability will be questioned at 184 pounds. Quicker than fast. Gets buckled as a blocker.

Lousaka Polite Pittsburgh – 5113, 244, free agent. Pulled hamstring first day. Looked slow before he pulled.

Wide Receivers

Michael Jenkins Ohio State – 6042, 217, 2nd round. Big receiver with good hands. Strong physical player that can break tackles. Generally reliable and consistent catcher but dropped one of Navarre's best throws in game. Conversely, he made an excellent catch behind him. Can pluck and snatch ball. Can get off of bump coverage. Picks up speed as he gets downfield. Deceptive speed. Can escape press. Increases speed with stride. Good route runner. Good ball reaction and focus. Can make the physical adjustment to ball in air. Has good jumping ability. Misplayed fade in Senior Bowl game. Has courage to go over middle. Will make the tough catch. Good quickness in and out of routes. Was born to run the slant pass.

Devery Henderson LSU – 5112, 191, 1st round talent. Explosive in and out of cuts. Lightning in a bottle. Can turn a short hitch into a big gainer. Has instant acceleration and burst. Makes plays. Outstanding body control. Will compete. Will catch the ball in a crowd. Good downfield blocking effort. Returns kickoffs. Former running back that has track speed. Sudden upfield burst. Dangerous on screens and reverses. Can track ball overhead. Hand catcher. Will pluck and underextend for ball. Has the lower body strength to break tackles.

Keary Colbert USC – 6006, 199, 1st round talent that may go 2nd/3rd round. Excellent vision and adjust to ball. Will reach and extend for ball away from body. Can pluck and snatch ball. Has confidence in his hands. A complete receiver. Has courage to go over middle. Wants to and makes tough catch. Can catch ball thrown behind him. Explosive, consistent receiver with strong hands. Has good jumping ability and timing. Slippery receiver that makes you miss. Has a quick upfield burst. Quickness in and out of cuts. Rarely drops ball. Catches ball at high point. Clutch, go-to guy that is the total package. Confident.

Ernest Wilford Virginia Tech -6035, 220, $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$ round. Big physical receiver that showed good body control and run after catch. Will reach and extend away from body for the ball. Big target on slant routes. Hand catcher that flashes quickness to get up the field. Can make physical adjustment to ball high or low. Has good jumping ability. Doesn't

appear to be a natural catcher but makes the catch. Good effort on downfield blocking. Covers up defensive backs with his size.

James Newson Oregon State – 6005, 203, 2nd/3rd round ability – 7th round speed. Good hands to reach and extend for ball. Will layout for the low ball. Can make body adjustment for overhead catch. Strong run after catch. Has good size and will compete in a crowd for the ball. Good route runner. Uses good body control on sideline. Reliable receiver. Physical player that will go over the middle for ball. Will be a solid 2nd or 3rd team receiver. Confident in his ability. Made tackle on kickoff team. Inconsistent to drive back to the ball at times.

Jerricho Cotchery North Carolina State – 6002, 199, 2nd/3rd round. Caught everything in practice. Outstanding natural hands. Confident. Can make the low hand catch. Will catch ball in crowd. Competes. Very good route runner and will double move defensive backs. Good blocker that will stay after you. Tough guy that will go over middle for the ball. Runs hard after catch – picks up RAC yards. Doesn't appear to have deep track speed but is sneaky and smart to get behind secondary. Can adjust routes on run. Doesn't get help up on press coverage. Gets separation with moves. Has excellent ball reactions. Good focus and concentration. Can get off of press coverage with strength and athletic ability. Accelerates as he goes down the field. Flashes speed and quickness in and out of cuts. Good ball reactions. Can track the ball. Good vision. Can adjust to badly thrown ball. Can be a 2nd or 3rd receiver next level. Needs to be a little more consistent but he can make plays. Needs to concentrate and focus on every play but he is a talent.

Can be a 2nd or 3rd receiver next level. Needs to be a little more consistent but he can make plays. Needs to concentrate and focus on every play but he is a talent.

Maurice Brown Iowa – 6000, 212, 4th/5th round talent but may go lower because of ankle. Ankle not yet 100 percent – injured in Iowa State game 2003. Can pluck and snatch ball away from body. Will lay out for the ball. Physical receiver that can break tackles after catch. Was not sharp in routes due to ankle. He was dragging his foot a little bit. Has good body control. Will catch the square in over the middle. Needs to improve blocking consistency. Will catch ball in traffic. Can make the overhead catch. Flashes of Musin Muhammad.

Johnnie Morant Syracuse – 6040, 225, late draft because of size. Short stepper. Big upright receiver that is inconsistent and plays too angular. Hands are inconsistent. Can make a tough catch then drop the routine catch. Lacks quickness in and out of breaks.

Triandos Luke Alabama – 5107, 189, $5^{th}/6^{th}$ round. Good hands. A hand catcher. Lacks strength to break tackles after catch. Will layout for the low ball catch. Quick in and out of break. Can make the overhead catch. Can track the ball. Had some drops in practice. Struggled vs. press coverage to get off jam. Has speed to be a 3^{rd} receiver the next level.

BJ Johnson Texas – 5115, 207. Injured. Did not play. See Las Vegas Classic notes.

Stacks up and creates pile. Aggressive player with a great attitude. Plays with good leverage. Quick and strong. Competes. Always moving and pressuring play. Disruptive player. Excellent instincts. Old time player that plays every play.

Darrell Campbell Notre Dame – 6035, 292, Draft 3rd round. Pushes pocket. Gets hung up on block. Can stack and control blocker with hands but needs to separate. Gets hands up on pass rush. Pressures QB. Intense player that finishes and will chase play. Has long arms and big hands. Penetrator type lineman. Not a take on guy. Needs to separate better.

Jordon Carstens Iowa State – 6056, 298, Draft 3rd round. High motor player. Gives effort and hustle on every play. Good inside push. Good initial quickness. Frame to get bigger. Draws inside double teams. Holds his ground. Has the ability to play DT, DE, or OT as a projection. Smart player that does what is coached. Will get high and washed down at times. Will play somewhere. Shorter arms than ideal.

Dwan Edwards Oregon State -6026, 309, Draft 2^{nd} round. Inside push player. Majors in the bull rush. Explosive at times. Quick arm over. Good lateral quickness. Plays on his feet. Has good instincts and feel inside. Presses the pocket. Plays square to the line of scrimmage. High motor fast twitch player.

Travis Laboy Hawaii -6034, 258, Draft $4^{th}/5^{th}$ round. Pass rush specialist. Edge speed rusher. Quick first step. Has the speed and quickness to run corner. Good laterally. May be a 3-4 rush end. Makes his plays in movement stunts, twists, etc. Disruptive player who can get up the field. Will run around blocks. No regard for run.

Shawn Phillips Purdue – 6027, 252, Draft 5th/6th round. Edge speed. Situation pass rusher. Fights pressure in the running game. Brings pressure from outside. Good effort to rush quarterback. Doesn't stay blocked. Has first step quickness like ND Kalu. May lack long speed.

Antonio Smith Oklahoma State – 6030, 266, Draft 5th/6th round. Plays both right and left end. More of a run stopper than a pass rusher. Good athletic ability. Will use arm over and bull rush on pass rush. God initial quickness. Has a tendency to get caught inside. Good chase player from the backside. Narrow stance. He lines up wide. Gets upfield quickly but out of control. Question instincts. He must see ball to run to it. Wired to Bubin #73 in one on ones.

Isaac Sopoaga Hawaii -6023, 321, Draft $4^{th}/5^{th}$ round. Thick lower body. Pushes the pocket. Good initial quickness. One move player. If he doesn't get the tackle he hustles to

the ball. Plays high. His first step is up so he gets caught by blockers. Good instincts. Will only be as good as scheme he's in - can anchor and hold his ground.

Defensive Line – South

Nathaniel Adibi Virginia Tech – 6031, 255, Draft 4th round. Good lateral quickness. Makes plays on movement stunts – twists, etc. Gets stuck on blocks. Flashes explosiveness and leverage but is not consistent. Appears to be more athlete than football player. Low motor guy that doesn't appear to understand game at times. Has raw tools.

David Ball UCLA – 6054, 276, Draft 4th round. Good effort player that makes sacks and negative yard plays. Plays with effort. Had a tackle for loss in game when he made play on reverse. Gets stuck on blockers. Aggressive. Will compete. Could work at right or left end. Basically a power edge rusher. Steady, not sudden.

Darnell Dockett Florida State -6034, 292, Draft 2^{nd} round. Explosive first step quickness. Shoots the gap. If he doesn't make play he gets bounced around. When he gets double teamed he gets rolled out because he doesn't stay low. No anchor to stack play on line of scrimmage. Disruptive player when he beats first blocker. Good athlete. Could be special in certain defensive schemes. If he doesn't make the play, he leaves a big hole.

Tommy Kelly Mississippi State – 6057, 302, Low draft. Passes eyeball test. Looks the part. Appears to lack instincts, awareness, and desire to play as an everydown player. Flash guy – boom or bust. Has good initial quickness. Gets hands up on pass rush. Better player tackle to tackle. Gets velcroed to offensive tackles. When he wants to bring it he is sudden. Not a hell bent for leather player in pursuit. May be better at DT if he shows some fight. Looks like he's playing to do everyone a favor.

Chad Lavalais LSU – 6015, 293, Draft 3rd/4th round. size may push him to 4th round. Understands leverage. Inside war horse. Quick first step. Pushes the pocket. Good effort player. Gets hands up on pass rush. Good agility in traffic. Fills the running lanes. Finishes play downfield. Has a burst to QB. Plays with good leverage. Can drive center back to QB at times. Sudden initial quickness. Always on the move. Great effort and pressure. High motor emotional player. Works from start to finish.

Rodney Leisle UCLA -6030, 302, Draft $4^{th}/5^{th}$ round. Inside push guy. Good lateral quickness. Gets driven out of hole when he plays too high. Aggressive player that has an upfield burst. Can be disruptive inside. Finished long and short pursuit. Active player. Big hands and short arms. Best when playing on the edge of a blocker. Gets wired to blocker at times because of short arms.

Bobby McCray Florida -6054, 252, Draft $6^{th}/7^{th}$ round developmental project. Gets stuck and manhandled on blocks. Slow off ball. Makes a play when he's not blocked. Slow twitch guy. He can be hammered the whole game than come up with a sack by accident. Usually not blocked. Looks the part and is athletic.

DeMarco McNeil Auburn – 6012, 306, Draft 2nd/3rd round. Rolled up on left ankle. Did not play in game. In limited practice time DeMarco showed good effort and hustle. Has a quick first step. Plays on his feet. Has a funny shaped body buy has good balance. Good lateral quickness. Generally plays with good leverage. quick to shed and find ball. Has a burst after initial contact. Good use of hands and feet in pass rush.

Quick to reach and seal. Good downfield effort. Effective on short pulls. Good use of hands and hand quickness. Can anchor. Good leverage player.

Jake Grove Virginia Tech – 6032, 300, Draft 2nd round. Versatile player. Could play OC and OG. Physical player. Thick and stout. Can sit down and anchor. Position, wall off blocker that will finish block. Does both shot gun and conventional snap. Maintains a good base when mirror and sliding against defender. Uses all his limbs and body to block you. Plays game on his feet. A throwback player. Good use of hands. Good initial quickness.

Nick Leckey Kansas State – 6026, 290, Draft 2nd/3rd round. Can play both OC and OG. Will compete. Works to finish and sustain block. Good use of hands to screen off and wall off defender. Maintains contact. Runs his feet on contact. Physical player on 2nd level. Great effort player. Good combo blocker. Leaks through and explodes on linebackers. Has a good punch. Good double team blocker. Takes good downfield angles on 2nd and 3rd levels. Gets his power from his bent knees and legs. Can dominate inside blocking. Good adjust on run when trapping. Active player. Good in space.

Stephen Peterman LSU – 6036, 312, Draft 2nd round. Offensive guard. Physical player, good punch. Not smooth but finishes block. Good on down blocks. Good combo blocker. Battler that will maul you. Will sustain his fold blocks. Effective on double team. Was beat by #98 Edwards in game when he dropped his head. Takes good angels to second level. High in pull but makes the block. Quick on cut block. Can manhandle opponent. Good use of hands. Effective to fold or log linebacker. Bends knees in pass pro. Stays on his feet.

Sean Locklear North Carolina State – 6037, 301, Draft 3rd/4th round. Played left guard. Has a tendency to lose knee bend and play high. Flashes a good punch to stone defender. Position wall off blocker that plays better inside at guard. Question strength at times because he gets high and loses strength. Can get driven back if he doesn't play low. Struggles with edge speed at times.

Jacob Bell Miami (OH) – 6044, 306, 4th round. Played right guard in Senior Bowl. Physical player that gives good effort to finish and sustain block. Physically manhandled

#95 Dockett and pancaked him later in game. Can leak through to get downfield. Dockett #95 beat him off inside move once. Not a natural knee bender – must work at it. Takes good angles to make his block. Has the quickness to maintain contact with defender. Has the foot quickness to adjust to movement. Can adjust on run when pulling. Will follow through with block. Can improve hand quickness – above average now. Can lock up power rush. Needs more work on taking away inside move. Better than average recovery.

Kirk Chambers Stanford – 6070, 310, Draft 6th/7th round. Played left tackle in game. Good thick legs for big man. Drops head in pass pro. Waist bender that is inconsistent to move his feet. Wall off position blocker in pass protection. Struggles with edge speed. Good on backside cut off. Good use of hands. Big body. Needs technique work. Smart.

Shane Olivea Ohio State – 6027, 312, Draft 4th/5th round. Played right tackle in game. Needs to move inside to guard. Has a tendency to lose his knee bend. Good seal block on Leisle UCLA. Dominated #55 Kelly. Adibi #83 couldn't shed him. Olivea owned him during the game. Strong on downblocks. Inconsistent finish and sustain. Steady player that must improve technique.

Travelle Wharton South Carolina – 6034, 311, Draft 5th/6th round. Played right tackle in game. Lacks height to be a tackle on the next level. Should move inside to guard. Plays high and gives up a lot of ground in pass protection. Gets driven back. Wall off position blocker. Question football intelligence and awareness. Better in pass pro. Walls off defender. Lacks intensity. Inconsistent 2nd level play.

Nick Hardwick Purdue – 6035, 283, Draft 5th round. Played center and left guard in game – center only next level. Scrappy, competitive player. Usually played in the shotgun at Purdue. Got better every day in practice making the conventional snap to the QB and getting into his block. #93 Lavalais drove him back. Inconsistent anchor. Light in pants. Good feet to mirror and slide in pass pro. Overextended at times and didn't bring his feet.

Bo Lacy Arkansas -6042, 302, Draft $6^{th}/7^{th}$ round. Played left tackle in game. Good feet to mirror and slide in pass protection. Effective on downblocks. Effective when he gets hands on you. Was beat on an inside spin move by #00 Laboy. Struggles with edge speed at times. Should play inside at OG or possibly right tackle.

Scott Wells Tennessee – 6014, 295, Draft 6th/7th round. Plays stout. Patient on pass protection. Wall off position blocker that stays on his feet. Gets his hands inside frame of defender and steers him. Good seal on 2nd level. Excellent help to guards. Good awareness. Shorter than idea. But makes up for lack of height with athletic ability. Does both shot gun and conventional snap. Can lock on and turn defender. Thick lower body. Does not long snap. Good balance. Smart center that can make the calls. Effective. Gets job done.

Adrian Clarke Ohio State – 6045, 334, Late draft/free agent. Flashes some wall off ability on pulls. Will overextend at times and goes to ground. Big wide body. Has

problems with edge speed. Must play offensive guard. Wall off position type player. Can stop a charge and anchor if he keeps knee bend. Soft body.

Max Starks Florida – 6071 359, 6th/7th round project that probably will be drafted earlier. Low motor, slow twitch guy. Huge tackle with a big wing span that doesn't move his feet. Flounders and is awkward in pass protection. Plays high and struggles to anchor. Driven back by #91 Antonio Smith and was beat off the edge by #00 LaBoy. Drops his head in pass protection. Waist bender. Takes bad angles. Has some lateral quickness. Lacks concentration. Question football intelligence and awareness. Loses his feet on downblocks.

Brian Rimpf East Carolina – 6053, 315, Draft 5th/6th round. Played right tackle in game. Has the size to play tackle. Overextends on pass protection at times. Had some good individual battles with #43 Ball. Will catch defender at times, not hit him. Generally uses his hands inside effectively. Takes good angles and walls off linebackers. Inconsistent footwork at times. Won all four one on one battles in practice. Wall off position blocker. Has blitz pick up awareness. Good on down blocks. Gets beat inside with quicks at times. Needs technique work. Better in pass protection than run block.

Sean Bubin Illinois – 6063, 301, Late draft. Played left tackle in game. Limited athlete. Will drop head down in pass protection. Overextends and goes to ground at times. Slow feet after start. Plays high and loses power. Big wall off position guy. Not a space player. Lacks foot quickness to consistently adjust and recover against defender. Big lumbering tackle that lacks the quickness to reach and seal. Loses contact with defenders to sustain and finish block. Below average quickness to get downfield. High on pulls. Struggles with speed rushers. Below average hand quickness.

Jeb Terry North Carolina – 6055, 314, Draft late on size only. Played left guard in game. Went to ground on pulls after contact. Loses his feet. Plays high. Has some balance problems. Will lock out on pass protection and work to wall off rusher. Lost all of his one on one battles in pass pro drill. Below average ability to redirect – he lunges. Goes to ground on downblocks. Inconsistent to finish blocks. Flashes a good punch at times. Cut blocker. Not patient – lunges in pass pro. Balance problems and slow to react to defender. Will drop head in pass pro. Inconsistent player.

Alan Reuber Texas A&M – 6057, 309, Draft 7th round/free agent. Played right tackle in game. Struggles with edge speed. #15 Shawn Phillips when by him like he was tied to a stake. Lacks strength and knee bend to anchor. Must be moved inside to guard. Plays with a wide base. Average foot quickness to mirror and slide in pass protection. Gets shoulder turned and has problems with speed off edge. Allows too much penetration. Needs overall body strength and technique work.

Gets a good break on the ball. Ultra quick linebacker that digests quickly. Good agility in traffic. Explosive player that doesn't always wrap up. Good range. Good use of hands.

Courtney Watson Notre Dame – 6012, 235, Draft 4th/5th round. Gets tied up on blocks. Good instincts and awareness to break up a pass. Good downhill player that is generally a good tackler. Will miss tackles because he doesn't always wrap up. Gives sideline to sideline effort. Quick to break up on passes in front of him. Can plant and drive. Can be beat in coverage by big tight ends. Active player that is always around the ball. Takes good angles and use of hands.

Grant Wiley West Virginia – 5117, 233, Free agent. Good instincts. Works through traffic. Lacks speed for next level. Undersized linebacker that throws his body around. Productive. Takes good angles and makes plays. Has average lateral movement. Plays with leverage but gets walled off by the big guys - tackles and tight ends. Has pass awareness. Needs to get more depth on drops. Will lose man to man matchups because he lacks speed. Good ball reactions.

DeMorrio Williams Nebraska – 6007, 229, Draft 6th/7th round. Good hitter. Cover linebacker. Quick to read and react. Has good hands to catch the ball. Will contribute on special teams. Active undersized outside linebacker that can't play over a tight end because of size and strength. Has sideline to sideline speed. Can close on ball carrier. Explosive hitter at times.

Has the speed to run the play down from behind. Will finish pursuit. Quick to shed blocker. Doesn't stay blocked. Good use of hands. Explosive hitter. Quick to read and react. A play maker that is good in coverage. A good wrap tackler.

Daryl Smith Georgia Tech -6017, 230, Draft $4^{th}/5^{th}$ round. Active player that works through traffic effectively. Tackle on the punt team. Should contribute on special teams. Smart heads up player that goes for the strip and makes plays. Will finish pursuit. Downhill linebacker that can run. He runs through his tackles. A thumper. Quick to break on ball.
